



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UNIVERSITY TRAINING: The program provides graduate students opportunities to participate in applied wildlife field research and to learn skills that will serve them in their careers as wildlife conservation scientists. As appropriate, the program forms partnerships and collaborations with other conservation and wildlife management groups and organizations investigating various aspects of the Laguna San Ignacio marine protected area.

**OUTREACH & EDUCATION :**LSIESP researchers provide classroom presentations at local schools on the lagoon's wildlife and its significance as a coastal resource for marine life and the local economy. Primary, secondary, and high school students visit the lagoon where they participate in "hands on" learning activities led by LSIESP researchers. This educational outreach program strengthens the students' awareness of the need to conserve Laguna San Ignacio and its living marine resources for future generations. LSIESP researcher host annual community workshops ("Reunions") to review scientific findings and provide a public forum for the exchange of information on the lagoon and human activities that affect it. The workshop participants include subject experts, representatives of government regulatory agencies, eco-tourism operators, local residents, non-government environmental organizations, students and instructors from local schools, and interested public.
